Psa. 92:7, “When the wicked spring up like grass, and when all the workers of iniquity flourish, it is that they may be destroyed forever.

Psa. 106:34, “They did not destroy the peoples, concerning whom the LORD had commanded them,”

Acts 3:24, “Yes, and all the prophets, from Samuel and those who follow, as many as have spoken, have also foretold these days.”

Acts 3:26, “To you first, God, having raised up His Servant Jesus, sent Him to bless you, in turning away every one of you from your iniquities.”

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ἐν τῷ ἀποστρέφειν *en to apostrephein*

ἀποστρέφω (*apostrephō*),

“to turn, to cause change in belief or behavior”

in order to turn every one of you from you iniquities, i.e., rejection of Jesus as the Messiah

Sadducees

- a. a disbelief in a bodily resurrection;**
- b. a denial of the existence of angels or spirits (23:8);**
- c. loyalty to the Roman government;**
- d. a desire to maintain the status quo;**
- e. an association with the wealthy class; and**
- f. adherence only to the Pentateuch.**

Acts 4:2, “being greatly disturbed that they taught the people and preached in Jesus the resurrection from the dead.”

causal;**

“to be thoroughly exercised with labor;”

“worked up, disturbed, agitated”

“because they were extremely disturbed”

pimplēmi

aor pass part

masc sing nom

“to fill, fulfill”

with the genitive

“of the spirit”
