“to serve, wait on, to take care of someone”

Eph. 6:18; Col. 4:2 used of prayer**

Col. 4:2, “Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving;”

Acts 6:4, “ ‘but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word.’

Acts 6:5, “And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch,”

Acts 6:6, “whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them.”

Num. 27:22, “So Moses did as the LORD commanded him. He took Joshua and set him before Eleazar the priest and before all the congregation.

Num. 27:23, “And he laid his hands on him and inaugurated him, just as the LORD commanded by the hand of Moses.”
