



Messianic Type: Grace in Action 1 Samuel 30:1–31

1 Sam. 30:1, "Now it happened, when David and his men came to Ziklag, on the third day, that the Amalekites had invaded the South and Ziklag, attacked Ziklag and burned it with fire,

1 Sam. 30:2, "and had taken captive the women and those who were there, from small to great; they did not kill anyone, but carried them away and went their way."



Israel and Amalek

- 1 Sam. 15:1, "Samuel also said to Saul, 'The LORD sent me to anoint you king over His people, over Israel. Now therefore, heed the voice of the words of the LORD.
- 1 Sam. 15:2, "Thus says the LORD of hosts: 'I will punish Amalek for what he did to Israel, how he ambushed him on the way when he came up from Egypt.
- 1 Sam. 15:3, "'Now go and attack Amalek, and utterly destroy all that they have, and do not spare them. But kill both man and woman, infant and nursing child, ox and sheep, camel and donkey.'"



Num. 13:29, "The Amalekites dwell in the land of the South [Negev]; the Hittites, the Jebusites, and the Amorites dwell in the mountains; and the Canaanites dwell by the sea and along the banks of the Jordan."

Judg. 12:15, "Then Abdon the son of Hillel the Pirathonite died and was buried in Pirathon in the land of Ephraim, in the mountains of the <u>Amalekites</u>."





Ex. 17:14, "Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Write this for a memorial in the book and recount it in the hearing of Joshua, that I will utterly blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven.'

Ex. 17:15, "And Moses built an altar and called its name, *The-LORD-Is-My-Banner*;

Ex. 17:16, "for he said, 'Because the LORD has sworn: the LORD will have war with Amalek from generation to generation."

Deut. 25:17, "Remember what Amalek did to you on the way as you were coming out of Egypt,

Deut. 25:18, "how he met you on the way and attacked your rear ranks, all the stragglers at your rear, when you were tired and weary; and he did not fear God.

Deut. 25:19, "Therefore it shall be, when the LORD your God has given you rest from your enemies all around, in the land which the LORD your God is giving you to possess as an inheritance, that you will blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven. You shall not forget."

1 Sam. 30:3, "So David and his men came to the city, and there it was, burned with fire; and their wives, their sons, and their daughters had been taken captive.

1 Sam. 30:4, "Then David and the people who were with him lifted up their voices and wept, until they had no more power to weep."

1 Sam. 30:6, "Now David was greatly distressed, for the people spoke of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved, every man for his sons and his daughters. But David strengthened himself in the LORD his God."

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Psa. 18:2, "The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; My God, my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

Psa. 18:17, "He delivered me from my strong enemy, from those who hated me, for they were too strong for me."

Psa. 18:19, "He also brought me out into a broad place; He delivered me because He delighted in me."

Psa. 31:24, "Be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart, all you who hope in the LORD."

1 Sam. 30:7, "Then David said to Abiathar the priest, Ahimelech's son, 'Please bring the ephod here to me.' And Abiathar brought the ephod to David.

1 Sam. 30:8, "So David inquired of the LORD, saying, 'Shall I pursue this troop? Shall I overtake them?' And He answered him, 'Pursue, for you shall surely overtake them and without fail recover all.'"

1 Sam. 30:9, "So David went, he and the six hundred men who were with him, and came to the Brook Besor, where some were left behind.

1 Sam. 30:10, "But David pursued, he and four hundred men; for two hundred stayed behind, who were so weary that they could not cross the Brook Besor."

Eph. 4:8, "Therefore He says: 'When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, and gave gifts to men.'" ~quote from Psa. 68:18

1 Sam. 30:11, "Then they found an Egyptian in the field, and brought him to David; and they gave him bread and he ate, and they let him drink water.

1 Sam. 30:12, "And they gave him a piece of a cake of figs and two clusters of raisins. So when he had eaten, his strength came back to him; for he had eaten no bread nor drunk water for three days and three nights."

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1 Sam. 30:12, "And they gave him a piece of a cake of figs and two clusters of raisins. So when he had eaten, his strength came back to him; for he had eaten no bread nor drunk water for three days and three nights.

1 Sam. 30:13, "Then David said to him, 'To whom do you belong, and where are you from?' And he said, 'I am a young man from Egypt, servant of an Amalekite; and my master left me behind, because three days ago I fell sick.'"

Literally, I was sick three days; there is no "ago" in the text. Implies three days = three days and nights.

Esth. 4:16, "Go, gather all the Jews who are present in Shushan, and fast for me; neither eat nor drink for three days, night or day. My maids and I will fast likewise. And so I will go to the king, which is against the law; and if I perish, I perish!"

Esth. 4:17, "So Mordecai went his way and did according to all that Esther commanded him.

Esth. 5:1, "Now it happened on [be, lit. "in"] the third day that Esther put on her royal robes and stood in the inner court of the king's palace, across from the king's house, while the king sat on his royal throne in the royal house, facing the entrance of the house."

Luke 24:19, "And He said to them, 'What things?' So they said to Him, 'The things concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people,

Luke 24:20, "'and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to be condemned to death, and crucified Him.

Luke 24:21, "'But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, today [Sunday] is the third day since these things happened.'"

1 Sam. 30:14, "'We made an invasion of the southern area of the Cherethites, in the territory which belongs to Judah, and of the southern area of Caleb; and we burned Ziklag with fire.'

1 Sam. 30:15, "And David said to him, 'Can you take me down to this troop?'

So he said, 'Swear to me by God that you will neither kill me nor deliver me into the hands of my master, and I will take you down to this troop.'

1 Sam. 30:16, "And when he had brought him down, there they were, spread out over all the land, eating and drinking and dancing, because of all the great spoil which they had taken from the land of the Philistines and from the land of Judah."

1 Sam. 30:17, "Then David attacked them from twilight until the evening of the next day. Not a man of them escaped, except four hundred young men who rode on camels and fled."

BDB has evening, but HALOT has morning; but Dict of Classical Hebrew says usually twilight of evening, but in several places it is morning twilight.

- 1 Sam. 30:18, "So David recovered all that the Amalekites had carried away, and David rescued his two wives.
- 1 Sam. 30:19, "And nothing of theirs was lacking, either small or great, sons or daughters, spoil or anything which they had taken from them; David recovered all."

1 Sam. 30:20, "Then David took all the flocks and herds they had driven before those other livestock, and said, 'This is David's spoil.'

1 Sam. 30:21, "Now David came to the two hundred men who had been so weary that they could not follow David, whom they also had made to stay at the Brook Besor. So they went out to meet David and to meet the people who were with him. And when David came near the people, he greeted them.

1 Sam. 30:22, "Then all the wicked and worthless men of those who went with David answered and said, 'Because they did not go with us, we will not give them any of the spoil that we have recovered, except for every man's wife and children, that they may lead them away and depart.'"

- 1 Sam. 30:23, "But David said, 'My brethren, you shall not do so with what the LORD has given us, who has preserved us and delivered into our hand the troop that came against us.
- 1 Sam. 30:24, "'For who will heed you in this matter? But as his part is who goes down to the battle, so shall his part be who stays by the supplies; they shall share alike.'
- 1 Sam. 30:25, "So it was, from that day forward; he made it a statute and an ordinance for Israel to this day."
