Born again

Regeneration

<u>Titus 3:5</u>, "not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration, that is, renewing of the Holy Spirit,"

At that point we are a new creature in Christ.

2 Cor. 5:17, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new."

Abundant life is the result of our spiritual growth and maturation


- 2 Pet. 1:3, "as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue,


