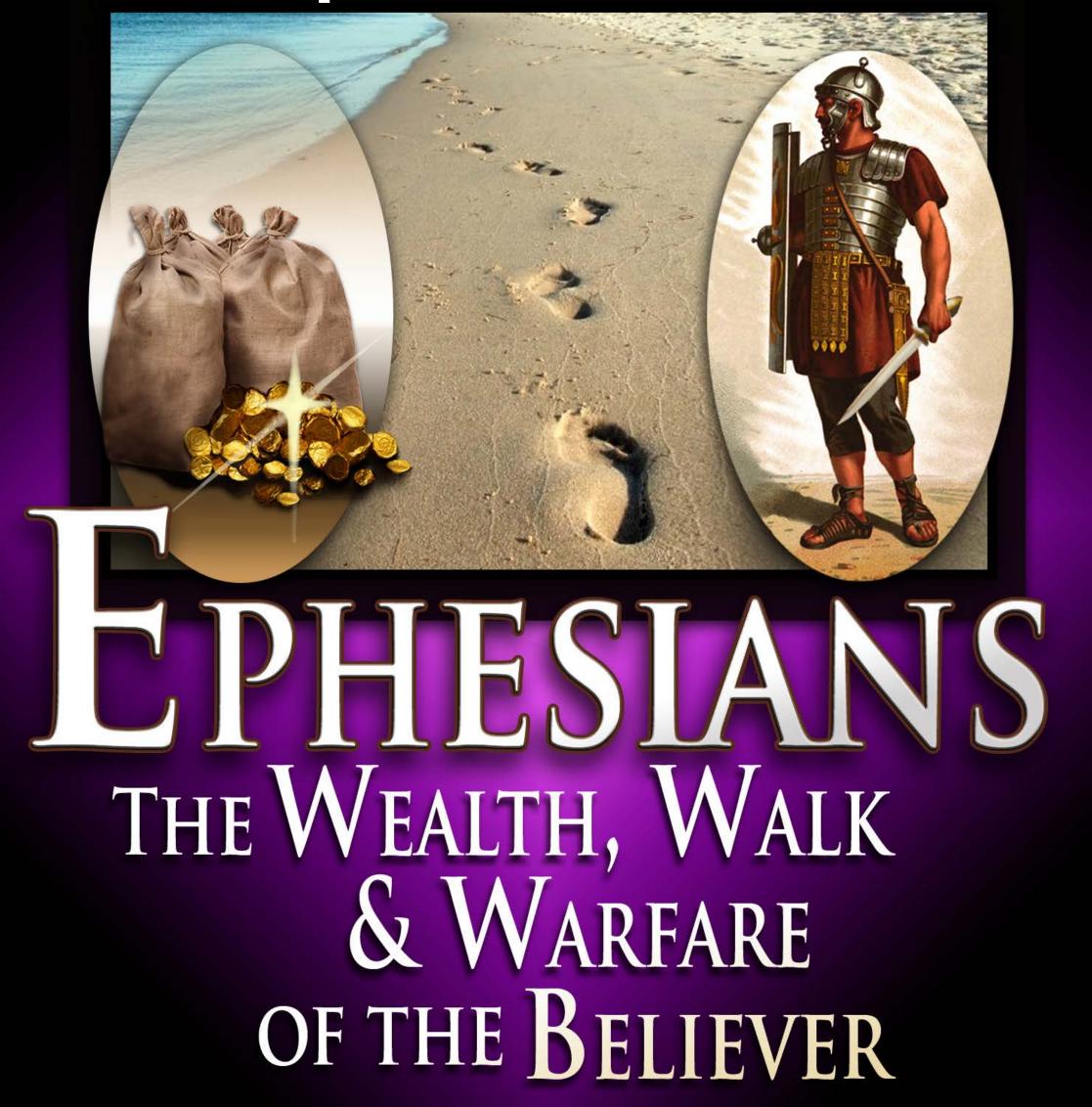

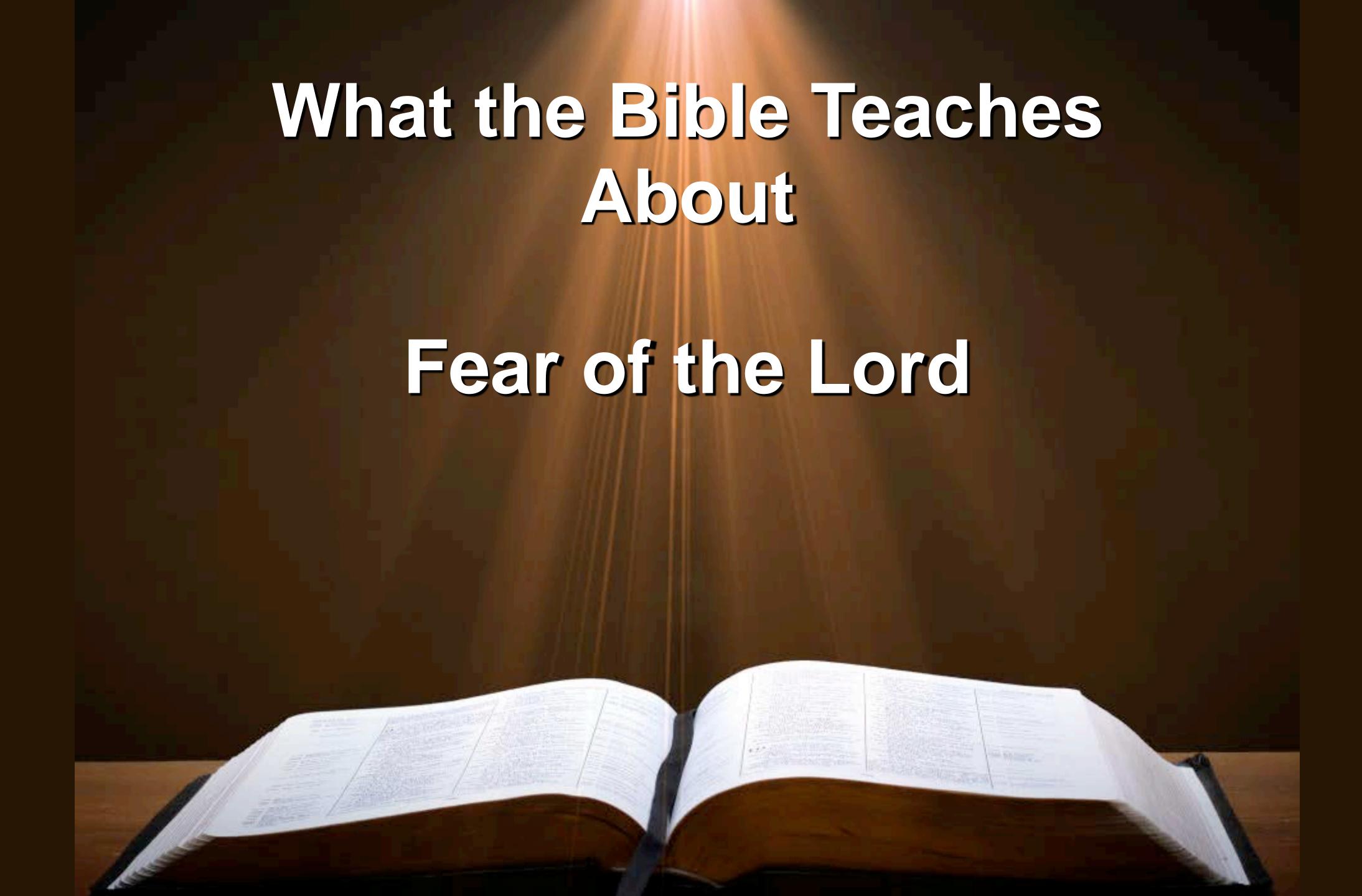

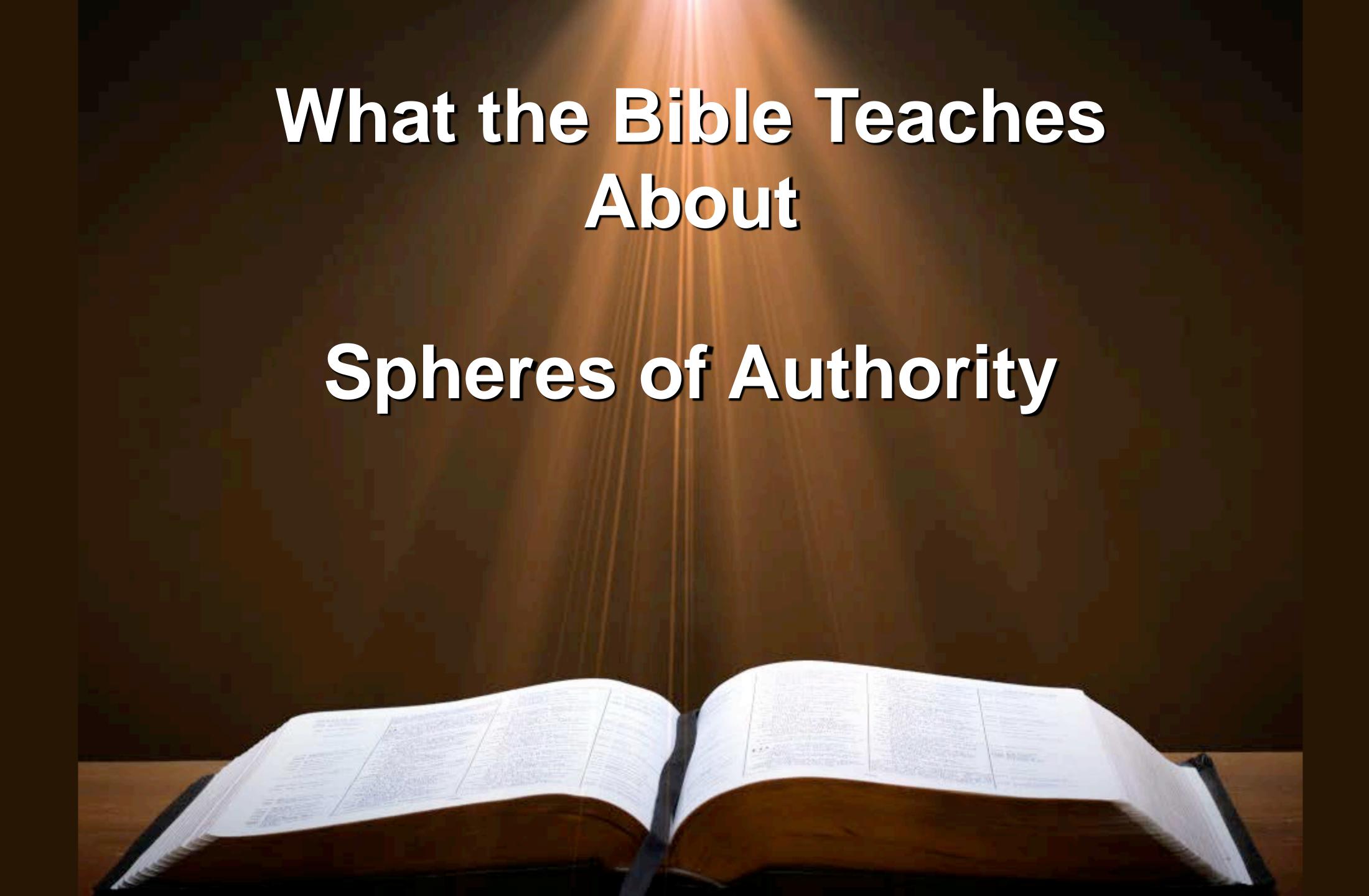

Human viewpoint leadership: dominate, control

Matt. 20:26, "Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to become great among you, let him be your servant.

Matt. 20:27, "And whoever desires to be first among you, let him be your <u>slave</u>— δοῦλος *doulos* slave; servant

Matt. 20:28, "just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." [NKJV]

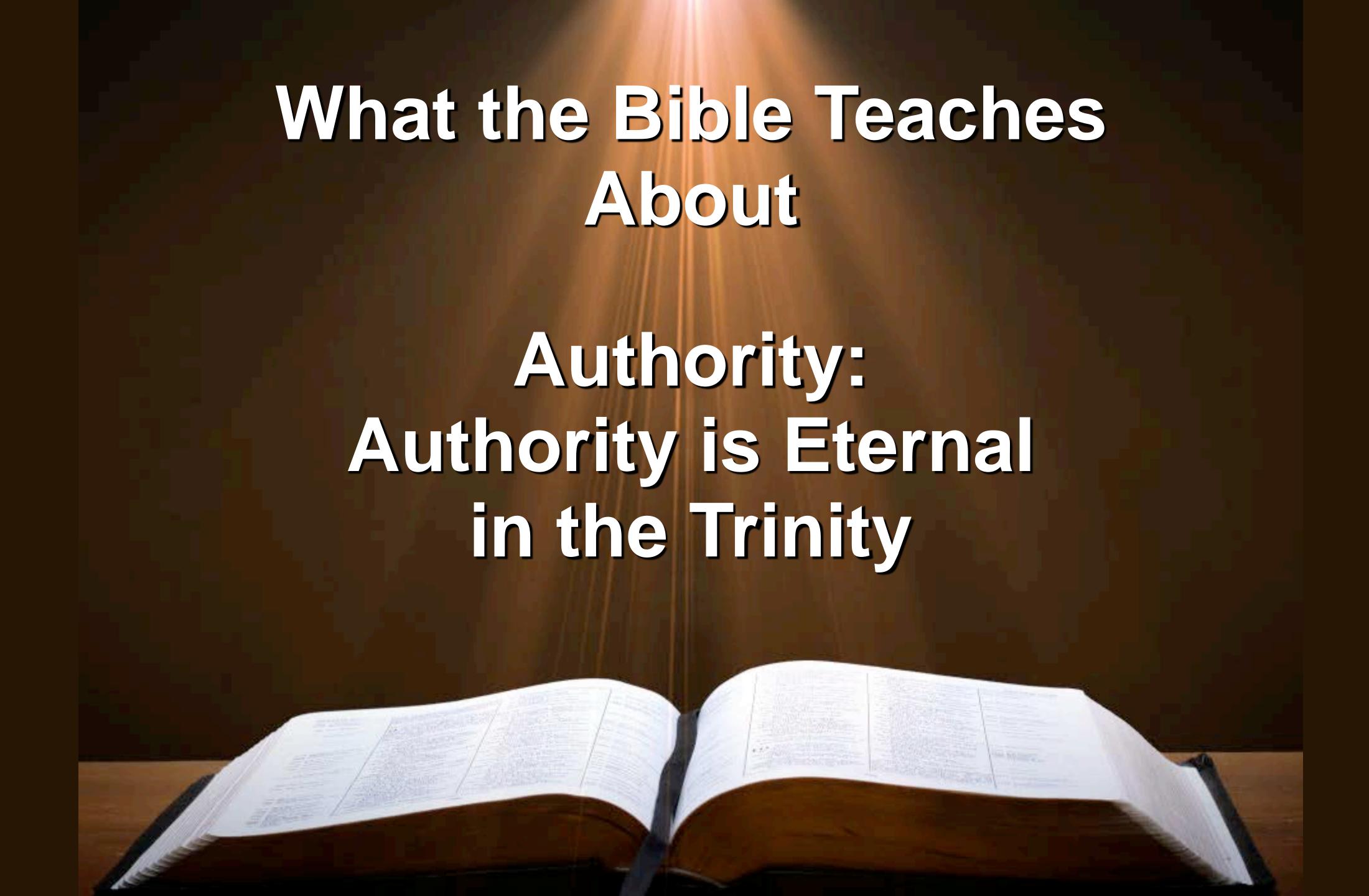
DVP leadership: Christlike humility

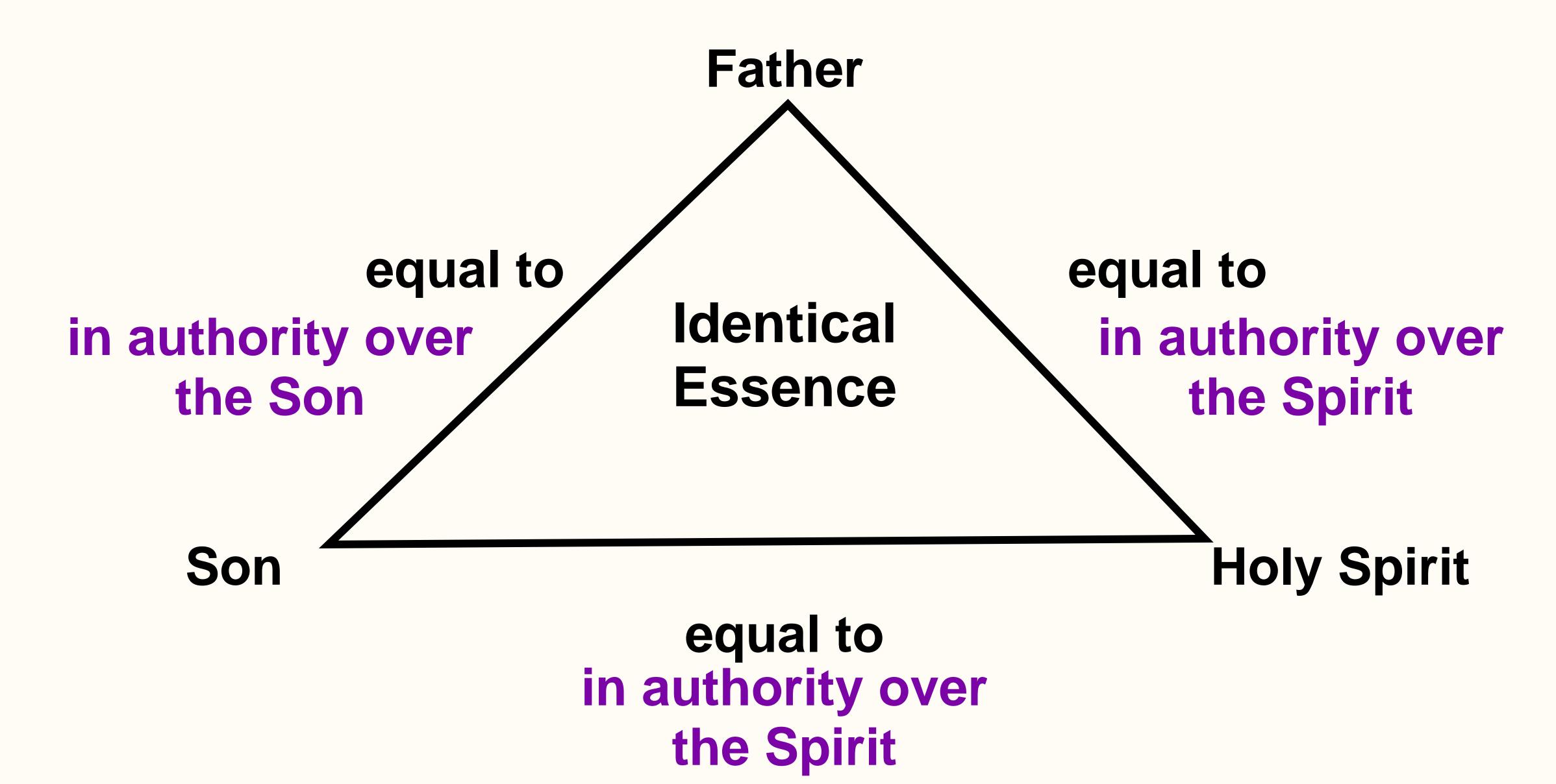
Php. 2:8, "And by [or when?] being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross." [RD]

Conclusion:

- 1. God institutes spheres of authority within the creation.
- 2. Because of sin, legitimate authorities frequently misuse and abuse that authority, they exercise their authority in an illegitimate manner.
- 3. Does this mean that those who are under those authorities have the right to disobey those authorities?



Authority in the Triune Relationships

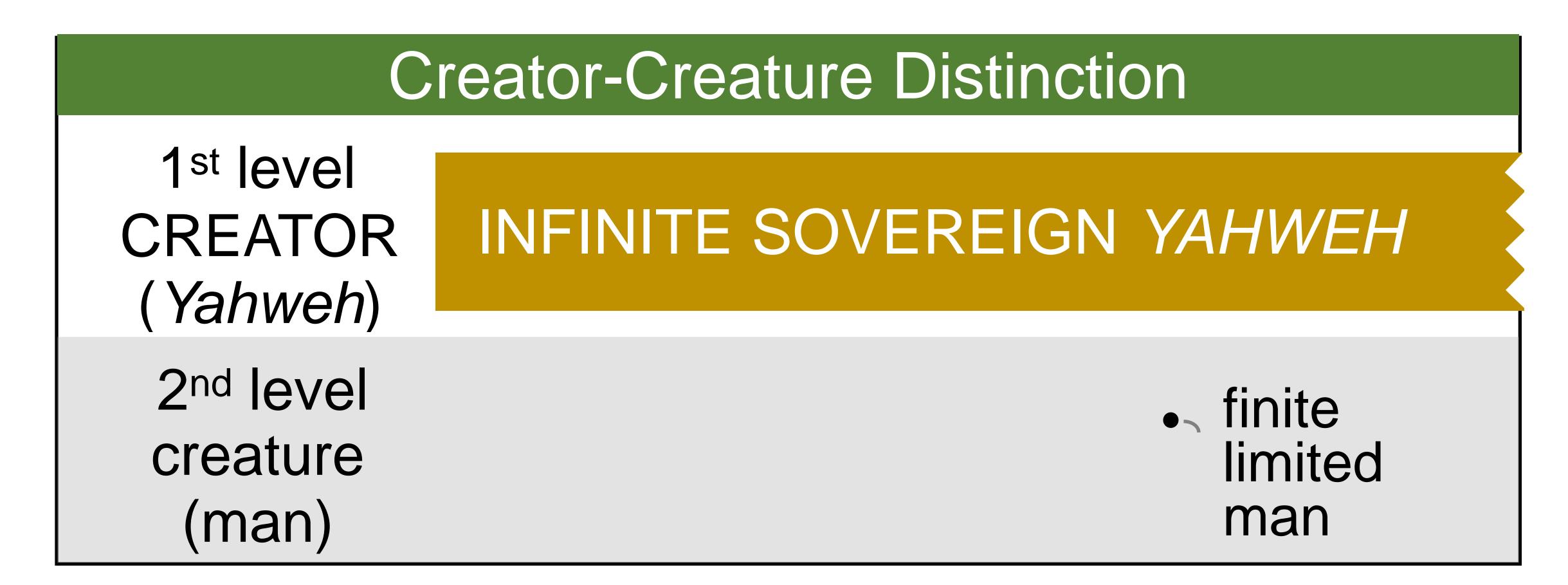


Why Does the Bible Place Such an Emphasis on:

Authority Leadership

Obedience
Disobedience
Rebellion?

This was the original sin when Satan sinned, he rebelled against God the Creator.



Rebellion against *legitimate* authority then is asserting that we, the finite creature, know more about what is best than God.

When it comes to the spheres of authority God has established, rebellion against them is ultimately a rejection of God who established those authorities.

Eph. 5:22, "Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord."

Eph. 5:24, "Therefore, just as the church is <u>subject</u> to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything."

basic meaning is: to submit to one's control; to yield to one's admonition or advice: absolutely. BDAG: "Of submission in the sense of voluntary yielding in love"

Conclusions:

- 1. The creation of human beings is not an accidental development over millennia, but a planned, intentional creation by God designed to fulfill His intended purpose for human beings.
- 2. God created the human race in His image. This distinguishes humans from all other creatures.

Conclusions:

- 3. As full image bearers, human males and human females are equal in their nature as divine image bearers.
- 4. Definitions of humanity that have a starting place other than revelation, i.e., start with human reason or experience without accepting the divine revelation, will distort, confuse, disrupt, corrupt, and fall far short of their understanding of what makes us human, and what makes men and women equal.

Conclusions:

5. The five-fold commands related to humanity's mission apply equally to male and female as image bearers.

- 1. God created both male and female humans equal in their being, their essence, as image bearers to reflect in a finite way the Creator-God.
- 2. Male and female humans were together given the fivefold mission of Gen. 1:28.
- 3. Though both male and female humans were equal in their nature, being, essence, God designed them to fulfill distinct roles.
- 4. These distinct roles do not imply inferiority, just as the distinct roles of the Triune Persons of the Godhead do not imply inferiority.

- 5. The entry of sin did not destroy the image of God in them, neither did it totally destroy the mission. But it brought a level of corruption and self-centeredness and self-absorption that made it difficult for the man and woman to fulfill that mission, but not impossible.
- 6. The only hope will be found in a spiritual restoration: regeneration followed by spiritual growth and submission to the authority of God.

Gen. 3:1, "Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, 'Has God indeed said, "You shall not eat of every tree of the garden"?'

The Hebrew word "desire" (tešûqâ) has some of the same uses that the English word has. In this passage it is commonly explained to mean that the woman would be drawn to her husband, probably so explained on the basis of the usage in Song of Solomon. But the word also occurs in this context of Genesis with quite another meaning. According to its use in Genesis 4:7, "desire" probably should be interpreted to describe prompting to evil. The idea of the verse would then be that, because the woman prompted the man to sin in giving him something to eat, that is, taking the lead rather than maintaining a partnership, the man would have dominion over her. I would thus translate, "Your desire was to your husband, but he shall have the mastery over you." The punishment, then, would also be talionic for the woman. This view also finds support in verse 17 ("because you obeyed your wife").

[... Yet your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you] Measure for measure: you influenced your husband and caused him to do what you wished; henceforth, you and your female descendants will be subservient to your husbands. You will yearn for them, but they will be the heads of the families, and will rule over you.

Although sexual "desire" conforms to v. 15, better is the explanation suggested by Gen. 4:7b, where "desire" and "rule" [māšal] are found again in tandem: "It desires to have you, but you must master [māšal] it." In chap. 4 "sin" is like an animal that when stirred up will assault Cain; it "desires" to overcome Cain, but the challenge God puts to Cain is to exercise "rule" or "mastery" over that unruly desire.

If we are to take the lexical and structural similarities as intentional, we must read the verses in concert. ...

The "desire" of the woman is her attempt to control her husband, but she will fail because God has ordained that the man exercise his leadership function ...

Thus the Lord affirms in the oracles of judgment the creation order: the serpent is subjected to the woman, the woman to the man, and all to the Lord. "In those moments of life's greatest blessing—marriage and children—the woman would serve most clearly the painful consequences of her rebellion from God." [quoting Sailhammer, *Genesis*]

Conclusion:

- 1. In the sinless original creation there was an authority relationship within the marriage, but there was perfect harmony in the marriage team in serving God.
- 2. Sin fragmented and corrupted everything including the souls of the male and female, especially in ways distinctive to their original roles.
- 3. The New Testament reveals the only way to reverse and recover is through regeneration and spiritual growth, submission to the headship, "authority," of Christ.

Gen. 3:17, "Then to Adam He said, 'Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, "You shall not eat of it": 'Cursed is the ground for your sake; In toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life.

Gen. 3:18, "'Both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you, and you shall eat the herb of the field.

Gen. 3:19, "In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; For dust you are, and to dust you shall return."

2. That the authority within marriage is something that entered into human marriage only as a result of sin (the egalitarian view)?

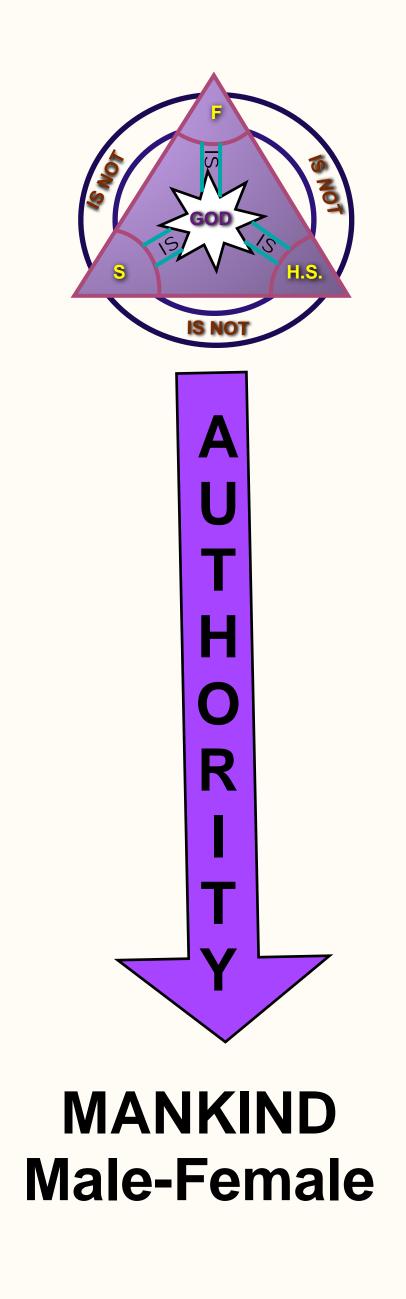
The view that God created males and females as <u>equals</u> in <u>both</u> nature and function.

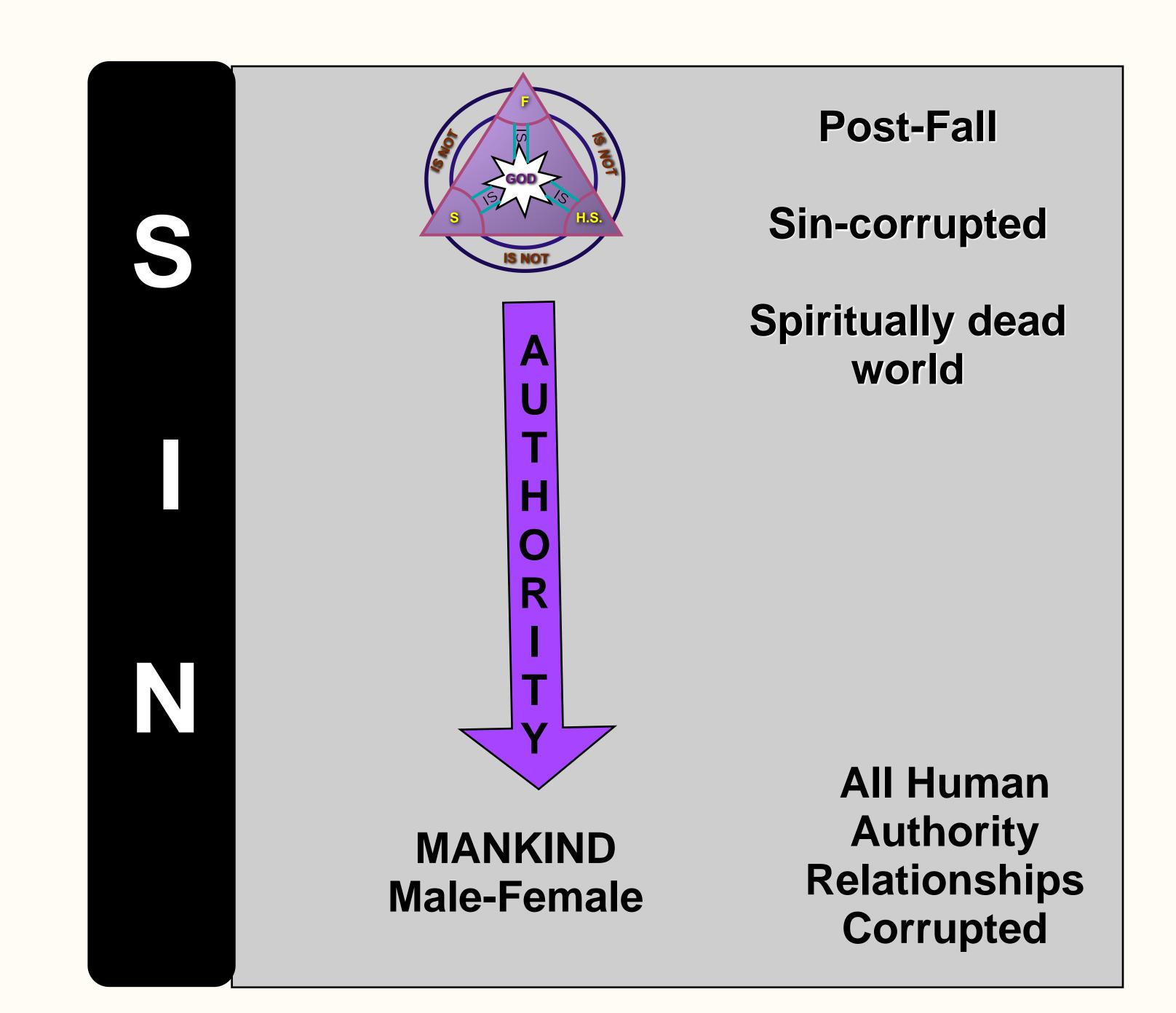
The interchangeability of roles.

The Biblical View

Complementarian

The view that God created males and females as intrinsic equals in nature and humanity, but with different roles which complete, complement, or enhance/improve the other.





1. The order of creation with the male created first indicates God's design and intention for male headship in the marriage relationship.
