

What the Bible Teaches About Standards for Leaders

2. OT qualifications for leaders.

Ex. 18:20, "And you shall teach them the statutes and the laws, and show them the way in which they must walk and the work they must do.

Ex. 18:21, "Moreover you shall select from all the people able men, such as fear God, men of truth, hating covetousness; and place such over them to be rulers of thousands, rulers of hundreds, rulers of fifties, and rulers of tens. Ex. 18:22, "And let them judge the people at all times. Then it will be that every great matter they shall bring to you, but every small matter they themselves shall judge. So it will be easier for you, for they will bear the burden with you."

Judg. 3:1, "Now these are the nations which the LORD left, that He might test Israel by them, that is, all who had not known any of the wars in Canaan

Judg. 3:2, "(this was only so that the generations of the children of Israel might be taught to know war, at least those who had not formerly known it),"

Judg. 2:22, "so that through them I may test Israel, whether they will keep the ways of the LORD, to walk in them as their fathers kept them, or not."

Judg. 3:1, "Now these are the nations which the LORD left, that He might test Israel by them, that is, all who had not known any of the wars in Canaan

Judg. 3:2, "(this was only so that the generations of the children of Israel might be taught to know war, at least those who had not formerly known it),

Judg. 3:3, "namely, five lords of the Philistines, all the Canaanites, the Sidonians, and the Hivites who dwelt in Mount Lebanon, from Mount Baal Hermon to the entrance of Hamath.

Judg. 3:4, "And they were left, that He might test Israel by them, to know whether they would obey the commandments of the LORD, which He had commanded their fathers by the hand of Moses.

Judg. 3:5, "Thus the children of Israel dwelt among the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites.

Judg. 3:6, "And they took their daughters to be their wives, and gave their daughters to their sons; and they served their gods."

1. The earliest mention is in Gen. 10

Gen. 10:15, "Canaan begot Sidon his firstborn, and Heth;
Gen. 10:16, "the Jebusite, the Amorite, and the Girgashite;
Gen. 10:17, "the Hivite, the Arkite, and the Sinite;
Gen. 10:18 "the Arvadite, the Zemarite, and

Gen. 10:18, "the Arvadite, the Zemarite, and the Hamathite. Afterward the families of the Canaanites were dispersed.

Gen. 10:19, "And the border of the Canaanites was from Sidon as you go toward Gerar, as far as Gaza; then as you go toward Sodom, Gomorrah, Admah, and Zeboiim, as far as Lasha."

2. This list is different from some other lists. In the Abrahamic Covenant we have 11 different people groups mentioned.

- Gen. 15:16, "But in the fourth generation they shall return here, for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete."
- Gen. 15:18, "On the same day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, saying: 'To your descendants I have given this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the River Euphrates—
- Gen. 15:19, "the Kenites, the Kenezzites, the Kadmonites,
- Gen. 15:20, " 'the <u>Hittites</u>, the Perizzites, the <u>Rephaim</u>,
- Gen. 15:21, "the Amorites, the Canaanites, the Girgashites, and the Jebusites."

Deut. 7:1, "When the LORD your God brings you into the land which you go to possess, and has cast out many nations before you, the Hittites and the Girgashites and the Amorites and the Canaanites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites, seven nations greater and mightier than you,"

Judg. 1:34, "And the Amorites forced the children of Dan into the mountains, for they would not allow them to come down to the valley;

Judg. 1:35, "and the Amorites were determined to dwell in Mount Heres, in Aijalon, and in Shaalbim; yet when the strength of the house of Joseph became greater, they were put under tribute.

Judg. 1:36, "Now the boundary of the Amorites was from the Ascent of Akrabbim [from Scorpion Pass], from Sela, and upward."
