






The Great Chain of Being in History

Gen. 1:26, "Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.'

Gen. 1:27, "So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

Gen. 1:28, "Then God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth.' " ~NKJV

Matt. 19:3, "The Pharisees also came to Him, testing Him, and saying to Him, 'Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for just any reason?'

Matt. 19:4, "And He answered and said to them, 'Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning "made them male and female," [Gen. 1:27]

Matt. 19:5, " 'and said, "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh"? [Gen. 2:24]

Matt. 19:6, "'So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate.'"

Gen. 1:26, "Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.'

Gen. 1:27, "So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them." ~NKJV

ז'בֶּלֶם tzelem- image; The word basically refers to a representation, a likeness. Five times it is used of man as created in the image of God.

Gen. 1:26, "Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.'

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1. God specifically made the human race with a binary sexuality and human beings cannot undo that.

2. The human race was made that way for a purpose, so that they could have children to fulfill the purpose stated in the two verses surrounding Gen. 1:27. Creating them in His image related to their purpose to have dominion and to rule over God's creation as His representatives.

Gen. 1:26, "Then God said, 'Let Us make man [the human race] in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.'

Gen. 1:28, "Then God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth.'"

3. The image and likeness in Adam was designed to be passed on to succeeding generations. Even though that image was corrupted by sin, it was not erased.

Gen. 5:1, "This is the book of the genealogy of Adam. In the day that God created man, He made him in the likeness of God.

Gen. 5:2, "He created them male and female, and blessed them and called them Mankind in the day they were created.

Gen. 5:3, "And Adam lived one hundred and thirty years, and begot a son in his own likeness, after his image, and named him Seth."

4. Conclusion: God's desire was a sexually binary human race.

5. On the basis of what we have just seen, what God said of Adam and Eve, the first human beings, was true of all successive generations.

6. Nothing in Gen. 1:26–31 suggests, even remotely, that the woman participates any less in the creation mandate than the male. Women share equally in the image of God and in the creation mandate responsibilities.

7. The progression is that God created the human race in His image so that the human race, male and female, could together exercise dominion over living things. And in addition, He created them male and female so the human race could increase and fill the earth.

8. Genesis 1 does not talk about the roles of male and female, or their differences. However, those who attempt to say that on that basis Genesis 1 does not support differences in roles or the subordination of the woman to the leadership of the male are wrong.

Genesis 1 states the purpose for the human race as a whole.

Genesis 2 gives more details on the creation of male and female so that we can understand that the idea of division of labor was embedded in the original, perfect creation.

2. Does equal mean interchangeable?

The hidden agenda of interchangeableness.

The differences between men and women.

"Lady Nunburnholme has claimed that the equality of men and women is a Christian principle. I do not remember the text in scripture nor the Fathers, nor Hooker, nor the Prayer Book which asserts it; but that is not here my point. The point is that unless 'equal' means 'interchangeable', equality makes nothing for the priesthood of women. And the kind of equality which implies that the equals are interchangeable (like counters or identical machines) is, among humans, a legal fiction."

When God made humanity, male and female, both were equally in the image and likeness of God, BUT ...

each had a different role, and so male and female were designed physically, soulishly, and spiritually to be adapted for their roles.

<u>Deut. 33:29</u>, "Happy are you, O Israel! Who is like you, a people saved by the LORD, the shield of your <u>help</u> and the sword of your majesty! Your enemies shall submit to you, and you shall tread down their high places."

Psa. 70:5, "But I am poor and needy; Make haste to me, O God! You are my help and my deliverer; O LORD, do not delay."

Hos. 13:9, "O Israel, you are destroyed, but your <u>help</u> is from Me."

The current argument:

- Men and women are equal and interchangeable.
- If they are interchangeable, then they are the same, no barriers exist.
- To assert that males and females are equal in the sense of interchangeability, denies that which is of their essence, and thus destroys their significance.
- By changing something's essence, you change what it is, and in this case destroy its value.

Two Key Questions:

- Are men and women equal?
- Are men and women interchangeable?
