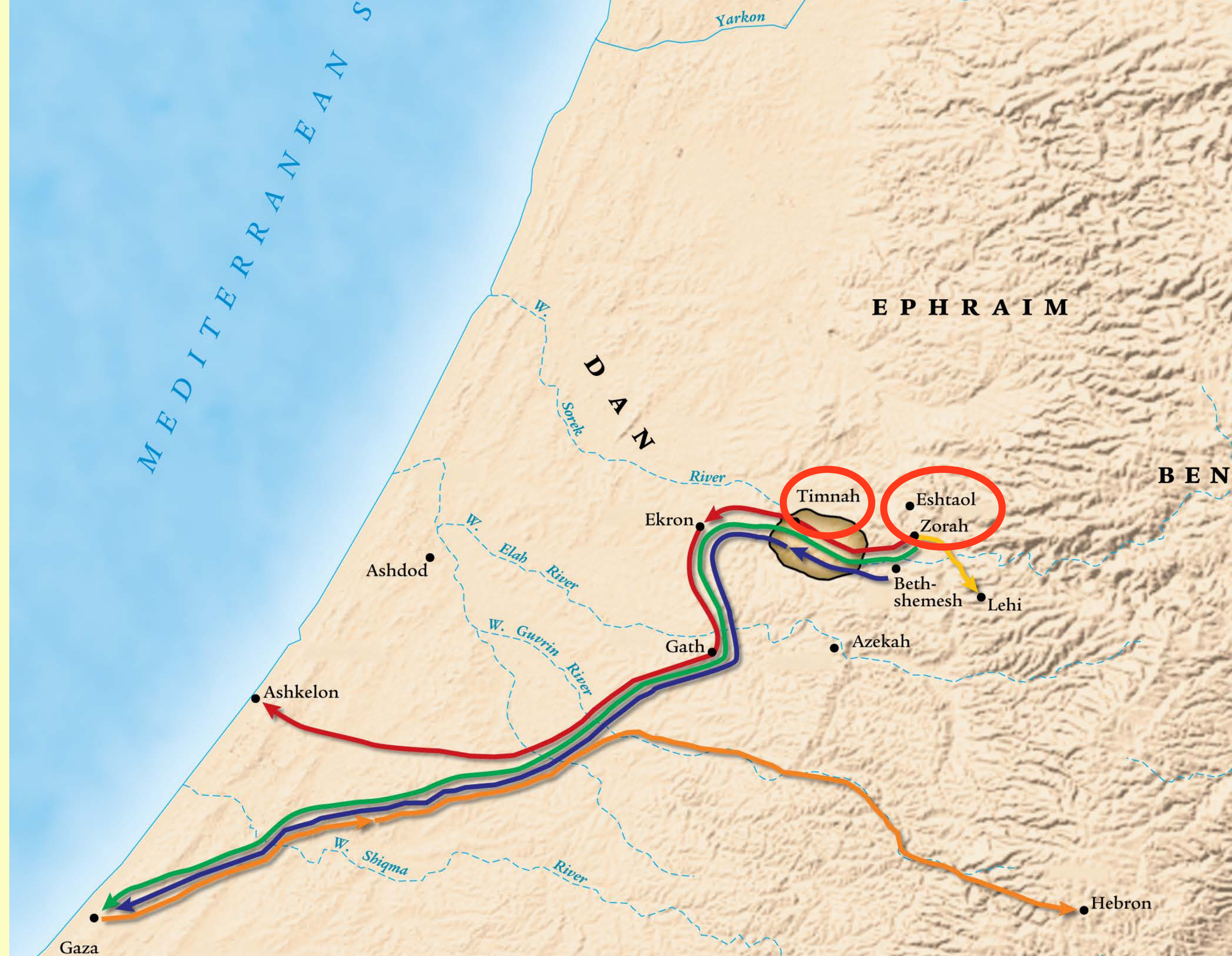

Six Basic Divisions

- 1. In Samson's father-in-law's house (Judges 15:1–3)**
- 2. Economic destruction by jackals (Judges 15:4–8)**
- 3. Samson is captured (Judges 15:9–13)**
- 4. Jackasses killed by a jackass jaw (Judges 15:14–15)**
- 5. God's blessing even on a rebel (Judges 15:16–19a)**
- 6. Self-absorbed Samson (Judges 15:19b–20)**

HALOT “ • *šūʾāl*, the animal mentioned in the Bible, is not the fox known in Europe but the jackal (see p. 225); DCH I 7 n.m. jackal (rather than fox)—pl. (שׁוּעָלִים) —jackal, an omnivorous mammal of the genus *Canis*)

Judg. 15:6, “Then the Philistines said, ‘Who has done this?’

And they answered, ‘Samson, the son-in-law of the Timnite, because he has taken his wife and given her to his companion.’

So the Philistines came up and burned her and her father with fire.” [NKJV]

Judg. 15:7, “Samson said to them, ‘Since you would do a thing like this, I will surely take revenge on you, and after that I will cease.’

Judg. 15:8, “So he attacked them hip and thigh with a great slaughter; then he went down and dwelt in the cleft of the rock of Etam.” [NKJV]

Judg. 15:9, “Now the Philistines went up, encamped in Judah, and deployed themselves against Lehi.

Judg. 15:10, “And the men of Judah said, ‘Why have you come up against us?’

So they answered, ‘We have come up to arrest Samson, to do to him as he has done to us.’

Judg. 15:11, “Then three thousand men of Judah went down to the cleft of the rock of Etam, and said to Samson, ‘Do you not know that the Philistines rule over us? What is this you have done to us?’

And he said to them, ‘As they did to me, so I have done to them.’ ” [NKJV]

Judg. 15:12, “But they [men of Judah] said to him, ‘We have come down to arrest you, that we may deliver you into the hand of the Philistines.’

Then Samson said to them, ‘Swear to me that you will not kill me yourselves.’ ” [NKJV]

2 חַמּוֹר *chamor*-2 comm masc sing abs “heap”

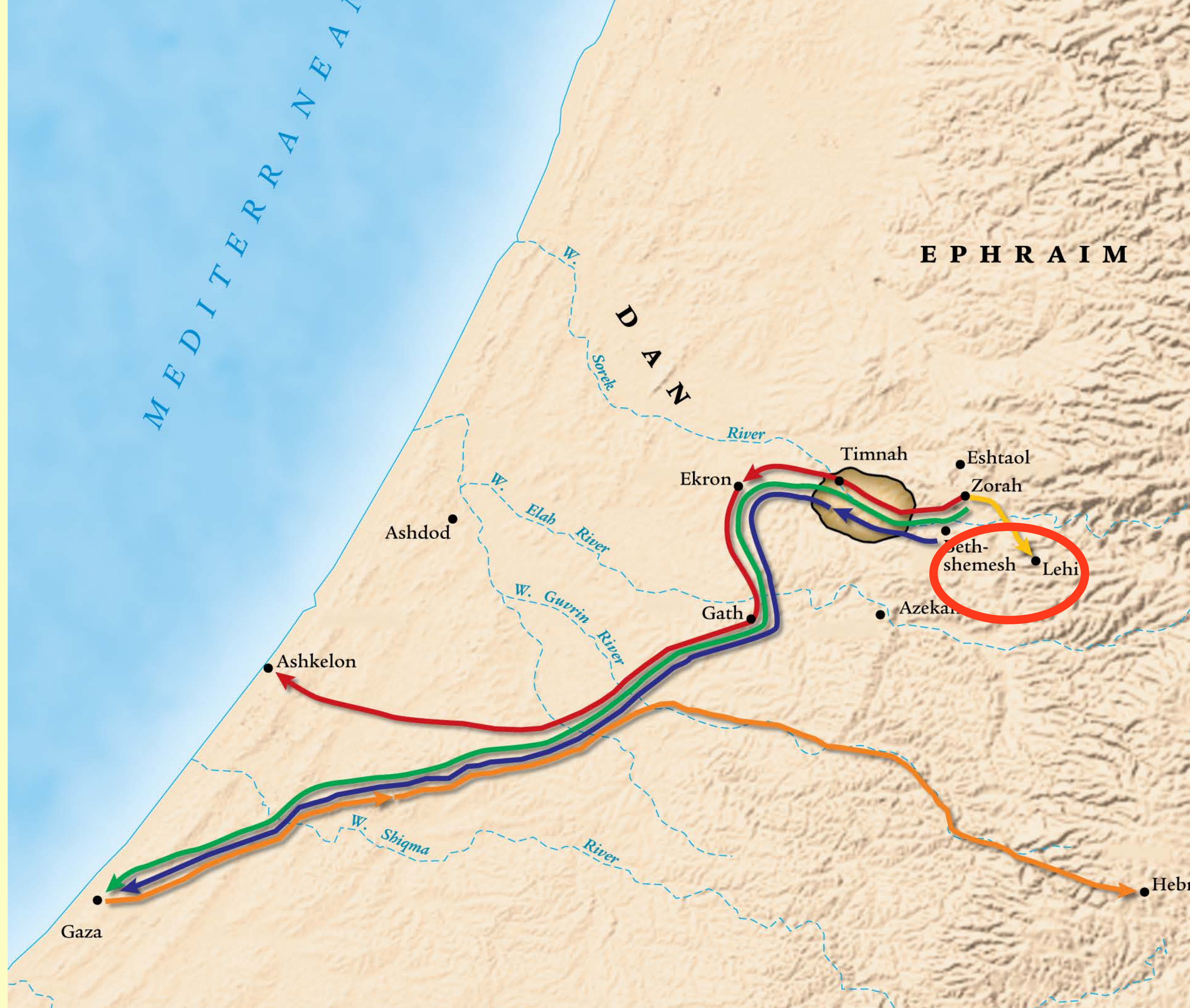
