

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
# Philippians Overcoming the World Philippians 1:6; John 16:33



#### Two views:

1. Every true believer is an overcomer.

2. Only believers who advance in the Christian life are overcomers.

Following the Bema there will be two groups of believers: those who have rewards, and those who do not.

#### Donald Grey Barnhouse:

"We can be sure that at the Judgment Seat of Christ there will be a marked difference between the Christian who has lived his life before the Lord, clearly discerning what was for the glory of God ... or a nominal Christian ... All will be in heaven, but the difference between them will be eternal. We may be sure that the consequences of our character will survive the grave and that we shall face those consequences at the Judgment Seat of Christ."

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What is overcome in this passage?

#### The world:

κόσμος *kosmos* masc sing acc world, the order or structure of Satan's thinking, i.e., arrogance in reference to himself and antagonism toward God.

John 16:33, "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have [already] overcome the world."

νικάω nikaō

Perfect tense: completed action

Jesus completed His victory over the world *before* He went to the cross.

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
Perfect tense: completed action

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#### What Did Christ Overcome?

- 1. Before Christ went to the cross He overcame the world.
- 2. The "world" or worldliness is different from sin.
- 3. On the cross Jesus Christ paid the sin penalty.
- 4. In His life He overcame the thinking of the world, setting the precedent for <u>our</u> victory over the thinking of the world.
- 5. Thus, overcoming the world is a post-salvation, Phase 2, function of spiritual growth, not positional truth in Christ, Phase 1.

## DEVIL



Rom. 12:2, "And do not be pressed into the mold of the thinking of the world (the zeitgeist), but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." ~RD



<u>James 3:15</u>, "This wisdom does not descend from above, but *is* earthly, soulish, <u>demonic</u>."

ἐπίγειος *epigeios*fem sing nom
earthly, terrestrial
"earthly" = oriented to the
Earth, rather than Heaven.

δαιμονιώδης daimoniōdēs fem sing nom demonic—related to the rebellious mentality of Satan and the demons.

ψυχικός psuchikos fem sing nom soulish, not spiritual; of the soul, or soulish, e.g., the thinking of the unbeliever, according to a nonbiblical worldview (naturalism, deism, existentialism, postmodernism).



1. Worldliness is the type of thinking of the creature Lucifer in rebellion against God.

κόσμος *kosmos* "an arrangement, ordering of things; order, world, mankind, earth; adornment, decoration"

- 1 that which serves to beautify through decoration, adornment, adorning
- 2 condition of orderliness, orderly arrangement, order
- 3 the sum total of everything here and now, the world, the (orderly) universe (~BDAG)

An orderly, organized system of thought providing the creature with a rationale for living independently of his Creator.

κόσμος *kosmos* "an arrangement, ordering of things; order, world, mankind, earth; adornment, decoration"

Worldliness thus relates to all of the thought systems of the world—philosophies, religions, mystical insights—which provide a rationale for suppressing the knowledge of God, disobeying God, and justifying the acts of the sin nature. Worldliness correlates to the thinking of Satan in his fall.

Isa. 14:12-14; Ezek. 28:12-19

The biblical concept of "worldliness" describes the collection of ideas, philosophies, religions, standards, values, purposes, and methods to achieve those ends, which characterize a culture or subculture. As such, this worldview incorporates and is expressed in every aspect of a culture's views of the individual and social relationships, theories of knowledge and learning, expressions of reality in visual and performing arts, science, technology, literature, and law. When the Christian operates within this thought structure, even though it may overlap in many ways with a biblical worldview, it is still classified as worldliness.

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3. Worldliness summarizes all human, Satanic, demonic ways of thinking, methodologies, and values which are in opposition to God.

Human Viewpoint (HVP), Paganism, Satanic Viewpoint (SVP).

James 4:4, "Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God."

"The theme of adultery is used in the NT in a metaphorical sense as in OT prophecy (cf. Jas. 4:4), where adulterers (moichalides; RSV 'unfaithful creatures!') are lovers of the world. Similarly, Israel is called 'an evil and adulterous generation [genea ponēra kai moichalis]' as it is typified by its religious representatives"; H. Reisser, ~NIDNTT, s.v. "Marriage, Adultery, Bride, Bridegroom," 2:584

James 4:4, "Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world [kosmos] is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God."

Who is the ruler of the kosmos, the world system?

John 12:31, "Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out."

John 16:8, "And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:"

John 16:11, "of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged."

John 16:33, "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

- 1 John 2:12, "I write to you, little children, because your sins are forgiven you for His name's sake.
- 1 John 2:13, "I write to you, fathers, because you have known Him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you have overcome the wicked one. I write to you, little children, because you have known the Father.
- 1 John 2:14, "I have written to you, fathers, because you have known Him who is from the beginning. I have written to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the wicked one."

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1 John 2:15, "Do not love the world, nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love for the Father is not in him. ~RD

1 John 2:16, "For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world."

1 John 2:17, "And the world is passing away, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God abides forever."

1 John 2:28, "And now, little children, abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming."

#### Conclusions from 1 John

- 1. The one who abides in Christ is parallel to the overcomer, neither of them sin. 1 John 3:9, 5:18
- 2. The overcomer is therefore not something gained at salvation, positional, phase 1, but experiential, phase 2.

#### Three Elements in Rev. 3:21

- The identification of the Victorious believer, the Overcomer
- Jesus' act of overcoming the world.
- The throne referred to by the Lord Jesus Christ as "My throne"

### What All Resurrected Believers Have in Common

- All get raptured
- All get resurrection bodies
- All have perfect happiness (though the non-overcomers have a period of shame at the Judgment Seat of Christ—1 John 2:28)
- All have eternal life and spend eternity in Heaven

## Contrast Between <u>Victorious Believers</u> and Defeated Believers

- 1. The victorious believer receives rewards, privileges, and blessings at the Judgment Seat of Christ (JSC), 1 Cor. 3:12–15
- 2. The victorious believer is praised personally by the Lord Jesus Christ (LJC), "well done, good and faithful servant." Matt. 25
- 3. Victorious believers have different levels of privilege and authority in the Kingdom.

## Contrast Between <u>Victorious Believers</u> and Defeated Believers

- 4. Victorious believers participate with Jesus Christ in His final defeat of Satan. Psa. 110:1; Rev. 19
- 5. Victorious believers will rule with Christ as kings and priests.

# Contrast Between <u>Defeated Believers</u> and Victorious Believers

- 1. Defeated believers fail to put doctrine first, count the cost, apply the Word, and grow spiritually.
- 2. Defeated believers are often wonderful people and successful in the things of temporal existence and the details of life.
- 3. But Defeated believers become distracted by the details of life.
- 4. Temporal loss of blessing and happiness.

### Contrast Between Defeated Believers and Victorious Believers

- 5. Shame at the JSC. 1 John 2:28
- 6. Loss of rewards at the JSC. 1 Cor. 3:15; Rev. 2:11; they become disinherited, but do not lose their salvation.
- 7. They will enter, but not inherit, the Kingdom. Gal. 5:19–21; 1 Cor, 6:10
- 8. Their rewards will be destroyed in the Lake of Fire, Rev. 21:8

# What the Bible Teaches About the "Overcomer" in Revelation
